

Diagnostic and Treatment Course for Speech and Language Impairments

Impairment(s) is often identified by pediatricians and/or other medical doctors, teachers, audiologists, other healthcare/educational professionals (including speech/language pathologists) and parents

Speech pathologist may conduct a speech/language (S/L) evaluation and refer to other appropriate specialists (e.g., psychologist, OT, PT, audiologist, educational therapist, etc.) dependent on the findings

Conducts formal and informal assessments and uses clinical observation

Speech pathologist conducts a speech/language (S/L) evaluation and refers to other appropriate specialists (e.g., psychologist, OT, PT, audiologist, educational therapist, etc.) dependent on the findings

The S/L evaluation may also assist in identifying other medical specialists important in diagnosing/remediating associated impairments, e.g., developmental pediatrician, pediatric neurologist, ENT, etc.

Diagnosis for impairment
